### **Entry Fee:**

Entry fee per athlete:

- 1100 CZK/ 45€

Entry fees must be paid by bank transfer based on the issued invoice, always for the entire team/club, no later than the invoice due date.

Entry fees are non refundable, even if the athlete does not participate in some or all registered events.

**Music files for all freestyle routines must be uploaded in the IJRU system. The audio file must be named by discipline, age category, and athlete(s): (e.g., DDSF 12–15 Anna Nováková, Jarmila Nováková, Petr Novák)**

### **Spectator Admission:**

Children under 15 and seniors above 65: FREE

Others: 50 CZK / 2€ (all-day pass)

## Judges:

Each team must register an adequate number of judges:

### Speed

- 1 complete judge for every 8 (or started) speed entry

### Freestyle

- 1 complete judge for every 8 (or started) freestyle entries
- If the team enters 5 or fewer freestyle routines, they may register only a presentation/technical judge
- Otherwise, a universal freestyle judge is required (difficulty + all other categories)

A competition entry = 1 athlete in single events OR 1 team in team events.

Judges must have **IJRU Level 2 certification**.

Speed judges must have a clicker or approved mobile app.

Freestyle judges will use official devices (7") with Rope Score. Personal devices are not allowed.

Judges must wear black clothing without images or team logos.

A fee of **1500 CZK/ 60€** is charged for each missing freestyle judge. A team **cannot participate** in the competition without the required number of speed judges (i.e., the team may only enter as many competition entries as corresponds to the number of speed judges they provide).

In the case of a registered athlete not participating, the required number of judges is not reduced retroactively, and judges cannot be deregistered.

- **Complete judge** = a judge who judges **all speed and freestyle disciplines in all age and gender categories**. One complete judge may consist of **a maximum of two persons**, and these two individuals function as a single unit, substituting for each other within that one complete judge. Each person in this pair must always judge the **entire discipline**. For example: if one of them is currently competing in the SRSS discipline, the other person judges the **entire discipline** (all gender and age categories), and vice versa.

The exact competition schedule will be published during the week prior to the event. Speed disciplines will take place in the morning, and freestyle disciplines in the afternoon. The organizer reserves the right to modify the schedule and competition organization throughout the entire day as needed.

A smaller hall will be available for competitors to warm up and prepare during the competition. This room will **not** be supervised; coaches are responsible for the safety of the athletes in this area. Participants are responsible for covering their own travel expenses, meals, and **insurance**.

### Speed Events:

- **Single Rope Speed Sprint (1×30 sec)**
- **Single Rope Double Unders Relay (2×30 sec)**
- **Single Rope Triple Unders – ages 16+ only**
- **Single Rope Speed Endurance (1×180 sec)**
- **Single Rope Speed Relay (4×30 sec)**
- **Double Dutch Speed Sprint (1×60 sec)**
- **Double Dutch Speed Relay (4×30 sec)**
- 

### Freestyle Events:

- **Single Rope Individual Freestyle**
- **Single Rope Team Freestyle (teams of 4)**
- **Double Dutch Single Freestyle (teams of 3)**

**All events follow IJRU Rules 4.2.0.**

## Age & Gender Categories

- **Up to 11 years**
- **12–15 years**
- **16+ years**

**Singles: men, women**

**Teams: men, women, mixed**

**Age is determined by the athlete's age on December 31, 2026.  
Team category is based on the oldest athlete in the team.**

**Minimum: 4 athletes/teams per category.  
Otherwise, categories are merged according to IJRU rules.**

**Top 3 athletes/teams receive medals.**

## General Conditions of Participation:

1. The competition is open to all athletes with permanent residence in the Czech Republic and athletes from other countries.
2. By submitting the competition application, the athlete agrees to the processing of personal data for the purposes and to the extent specified in the application form.
3. The club/school/team/parent is responsible for the health condition and medical examination of participants. Every athlete is required to have a valid medical certificate confirming that their health condition does not limit or prevent participation in the competition. The medical certificate must not be older than one year.
4. Each competitor participates at their own health insurance risk. Every competitor must have their health insurance card with them.
5. Supervision of athletes must be ensured fully and throughout the entire duration of the competition by the appointed club/school/team leader. If a minor athlete participates individually without a club/school/team, they must have an assigned adult supervisor for the entire duration of the competition.
6. The organizer is not responsible for the loss of personal belongings.
7. During the competition, it is prohibited to move around the competition floor except for organizers, judges, and athletes who are currently competing.
8. Athletes must behave respectfully within the venue, avoid causing public disturbance, be friendly to other competitors, and keep changing rooms, toilets, and all public areas clean. All personal waste must be disposed of in bins before leaving the gym and changing rooms!
9. Coaches/Team leaders are responsible for ensuring that their athletes behave properly at the competition venue and throughout the building, respect other competitors, are ready on time according to the schedule, do not leave the venue before results are published, are present at the award ceremony, and are prepared to accept their result and placement. They must generally behave in a way that sets a positive example for all participants.
10. During the events, it is forbidden to jump or warm up on the main floor. A designated smaller hall is provided for this purpose. Jumping on the main floor is permitted only before the start of the competition (before 9:00) and during breaks between events, unless the organizer decides otherwise.
11. During the competition, it is recommended not to wear watches, necklaces, bracelets, rings, long earrings, or any unsuitable jewelry.
12. Every competitor is required to attend the award ceremony, and in case of placement, must collect their award in person. If a winning competitor does not attend the award ceremony and does not collect the prize, the prize will not be awarded!
13. The organizer reserves the right to modify the competition guidelines if necessary.
